Since its release in 1990, Microsoft's Windows operating system has catapulted to the top of the chart for global Operating Systems. As one of the most widely used software systems in history, Microsoft's Windows is an integral part of modern life. That's why we've put together this complete guide on how to uninstall it! A common misconception with this system is that the 'Uninstall Windows 10' option is there for a reason. It isn't. This option is simply there to reset your PC and wipe any of the data on it clean so you can reinstall Windows 10 afterwards if you wish. Yes, provided that you meet the requirements for running Windows 10 and have a genuine license, there is no way to uninstall it that we know of (although we highly doubt Microsoft wants users to uninstall it). If you get to this point, your only option is to contact Microsoft support. No. There are no Windows 10 updates or future services that will be added to your system running Windows 10, nor will there be any upgrades for the operating system. The only way you can upgrade to Windows 10 is by purchasing a new license from Microsoft or by using an activated product key. This option will only work on Windows 7, 8, 8.1 and older versions of Windows. To do this, follow the steps below: Advanced Security Configuration Manager is a tool that allows you to disable individual permissions in the security settings of applications on your PC. This means that if you wish to run Windows 10 on your PC, then you will need to re-enable the operating system settings. Firstly, open the 'Start' menu and look for the 'Power' icon; select it and press the 'Restart' key (this will restart your computer and take you back to the screen you started from). Select 'Troubleshoot' from the list of options on your screen. From here, click on 'Advanced options'. From here, look for an option titled; "Open User Account Control Settings". This is where you need to go in order to do this. Click it in order to see another window appear with various options in it. Select the 'Permissions' option from this window. On the next window, click on 'Change User Account Control Settings'. This will open up another screen that you need to go into. Select the 'Security' option from here and then select 'Deny .NET framework 3.5 exception for all users'. Then restart your computer. This will close all programs that do not have full permissions to run, which should be just about every program that came pre-installed with Windows 10 (except for games). Note: It is important that you restart your computer now, as any programs left running after this point will not start up again because they won't be able to access files without permission. Yes.
